Narrative Report

I am a board-certified geriatrician and clinical investigator with a long-term goal to improve care of older adults with frailty by generating high-quality evidence, training future clinicians and researchers, and changing health systems and policy. My area of excellence is Investigation. My research aims to investigate how frailty affects the benefits and harms of common drug therapy and surgical procedures. The main areas of my research include 1) frailty measurement, 2) frailty and outcomes of drug therapy, 3) frailty and outcomes of surgical procedures, and 4) evidence communication to facilitate shared decision making.

Administrative claims data (e.g., Medicare data) are increasingly used to study outcomes of drug therapy in older adults with frailty, who are underrepresented in clinical trials, but lack of frailty measures in these datasets remains a barrier to generate evidence to guide treatment decision. I received a K08 Paul B. Beeson Award in Aging from the National Institute on Aging (NIA) to develop and validate a frailty index for Medicare data. The program to calculate the claims-based frailty index is available in SAS, R, Python, and Java to researchers (https://dataverse.harvard.edu/dataverse/cfi). I serve on the advisory task force to the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation of the Department of Health and Human Services and RAND Corporation in developing claims-based algorithms for frailty and functional impairment. I was an ad-hoc reviewer for the Knowledge Competition Award of the Canadian Frailty Network. Two of my NIA R01 awards apply this index to assess the benefit-risk balance of newly marketed cardiovascular drug therapy and procedures in people with frailty.

Older adults with frailty are often treated off-label with psychoactive drugs during acute hospitalization. Although antipsychotics have been linked to an increased risk of mortality and adverse events in older people with dementia, I have shown that antipsychotics remain widely used in hospitalized older adults and the choice of the drugs is mainly driven by the hospital practice pattern due to insufficient evidence. I received an NIA R01 award to study the risks of antipsychotic and sedative drug use in hospitalized older patients with delirium in two nationwide hospital datasets and 5 prospective cohort studies. As a result of my expertise on drug safety research, I serve on the American Delirium Society 2019 Annual Meeting program committee and participate in the meeting as faculty on the antipsychotics session.

In addition to evaluation of drug therapy, I conducted a prospective cohort study to evaluate functional status change in patients treated with transcatheter and surgical aortic valve replacement at BIDMC. Funded by a KL2 Harvard Catalyst Medical Research Investigator Training Award, this study showed that, despite symptomatic improvement, approximately 25% of patients experienced functional decline after the procedure. Preoperative frailty status was strongly predictive of functional decline. An online frailty index calculator is made available for clinicians (<u>https://bit.ly/2PA7iIv</u>), which has been recently integrated into the electronic medical record at BIDMC to facilitate implementation in routine practice. I have been invited to present my work on frailty assessment and functional outcomes in transcatheter aortic valve replacement locally and nationally, as well as at the American College of Cardiology, Canadian Geriatrics Society, and International Association of Gerontology and Geriatrics World Congress. Building on this work, I conducted a pilot randomized controlled trial of home-based rehabilitation intervention to improve recovery after transcatheter aortic valve replacement. This pilot study is funded by the Boston Older American Independence Center and Boston Roybal Center.

Lastly, I hope to improve evidence communication between providers and patients by applying more intuitive summary measures of treatment effect. Instead of relative risk reduction (e.g., "treatment X reduces mortality by 25% in 5 years"), it is more intuitive to measure treatment effect in terms of event-free time (e.g., "treatment X extends survival time, on average, by 3 months in 5 years"). Such

measures include restricted mean survival time and number of days alive and spent at home. Despite intuitive interpretation and availability of robust estimation procedures, clinical trialists have been slow to adopt these measures. My NIA R21 award aims to examine how restricted mean survival time is accepted by older adults in comparison with relative risk reduction and number needed to treat. I have applied this effect measure to re-analyze the effect of transcatheter aortic valve replacement, implantable cardioverter-defibrillator therapy, intensive blood pressure lowering strategy, statins, cholinesterase inhibitors, and COVID-19 therapeutics. In addition, I conducted a survey of older adults about their preference for restricted mean survival time versus conventional effect measures (e.g., hazard ratios) and led a working group in the American College of Cardiology Geriatric Cardiology section to train researchers about this methodology.

As a practicing geriatrician, I provide primary care and pre-transcatheter aortic valve replacement geriatric evaluation at the BIDMC Senior Health Practice. I am directing a quality improvement project to standardize assessment and documentation of frailty and functional status at BIDMC Senior Health Practice and Pre-operative Anesthesia Testing clinic. I participate in clinical and research training activities for medical students, clinical trainees, and research fellows at Harvard Medical School and Harvard Geriatrics Fellowship, and masters/doctoral students at HSPH. I also invite and train 1-2 clinical trainees and junior faculty from Korea and Taiwan every year at BIDMC. From 2012-2021, I have mentored 29 trainees and early-stage investigators in frailty and aging research. My effort in teaching and research was recognized with the Mentor of the Year Award in 2013 and 2020, and the American Geriatrics Society Junior Investigator of the Year Award in 2017.
